The transactions of WSL with AIA for the financial year 2017-18 is likely to exceed 10% of consolidated annual turnover as per the Audited Annual Accounts of WSL for the Financial Year 2016-17. The gross annual turnover of WSL for the financial year 2016-17 as per the audited financial statements is ₹. 21,901.20 lacs. The Company has adopted Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) from 1st April, 2016. The figures for the Year ended 31st March, 2016 are Ind AS compliant.

1. PRODUCTION:

During the year under review the Company produced 36,980 tons of Grinding Media as compared to 20,906 tons in the previous year. As reported earlier, the production in the previous year had to be curtailed due to adverse market conditions.

2. SALES & PROSPECTS:

The Company sold 36,646 tons of Grinding Media during the year under review as against 20,967 tons in the previous year. The prospects for sales in the current year also look to be fairly good.

3. **DIVIDEND & RESERVES:**

Your Directors are pleased to recommend a dividend of 20% (₹2.00 per share) for the Financial Year 2016-17.

4. FINANCE

The liquidity position of the Company remained satisfactory. Canara Bank and State Bank of India extended their full co-operation to the Company.

5. EMPLOYEES RELATIONS:

In general, the relationship with the employees remained cordial. The issue of disciplinary action taken against workmen who had indulged in misconduct is pending in the honourable Labour Court along with the issue of charter of demands put up by old union.



6. DIRECTORS:

Mrs. Khushali Samip Solanki, Director of the Company retiring by rotation at the ensuing Annual General Meeting and being eligible offers herself for re-appointment. A brief resume of Mrs. Khushali Samip Solanki is given as annexure to the notice.

7. NUMBER OF MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND AUDIT COMMITTEE:

Four meetings of the Board of Directors and Audit Committee were held during the financial year. For further detail of the meetings, please refer to corporate governance report which forms part of this Annual Report.

8. AUDITORS:

M/s Dagliya & Co., Chartered Accountants, the Statutory Auditors of the Company retire at end of the ensuing 45th Annual General Meeting of the Company. As per Section 139 of the Companies Act, 2013 and rules made thereunder, they will not be eligible to be re-appointed as Statutory Auditors of the Company. The Board of Directors, in its meeting held on 22-05-2017, on the recommendation of Audit Committee has appointed M/s. Ganapathraj & Co., Chartered Accountants as Statutory Auditors of the Company for a period five years subject to the approval of members in 45th Annual General Meeting. If appointed in AGM, they will hold office for five years from the conclusion of ensuing Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of 50th Annual General Meeting.

The Company has received a certificate from the auditors to the effect that the appointment, if made, will be in accordance with the limits specified in Section 139 (1) of the Companies Act, 2013 and they are not disqualified for re-appointment of within the meaning of the Section 141 of the said Act and rules framed thereunder.

As required under Regulation 17 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (SEBI Listing Regulations) the Auditors have also confirmed that they hold a valid certificate issued by the Peer Review Board of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

AUDITORS' REPORT AND NOTES ON ACCOUNTS:

The Board has duly reviewed the Statutory Auditors' Report for the Financial Year ended 31st March, 2017. There were no qualifications/observations in the Report.

10. COSTAUDITORS:

Pursuant to Section 148 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Cost Records and Audit) Amendment Rules, 2014, the Cost Audit records maintained by the Company are required to be audited by a Cost Accountant. On the recommendations of the Audit Committee, the Board of Directors of the Company have appointed M/s. Kiran J. Mehta & Co., Cost Accountants, Ahmedabad as the Cost Auditors of the Company to audit the Cost Accounting Records of the Company for the Financial Year 2016-17. The Cost Auditor has filed the Cost Audit Report for the Financial Year ended 31st March, 2016 with MCA within the stipulated time.

The Board of Directors of the Company have appointed M/s. Kiran J. Mehta & Co., Cost Accountants, Ahmedabad as the Cost Auditors of the Company to audit the Cost Accounting Records of the Company for the Financial Year 2017-18. As required under the Companies Act, 2013, the remuneration payable to the Cost Auditors is required to be placed before the members of the Company for their ratification at the ensuing Annual General Meeting. Accordingly a Resolution seeking members' ratification of the remuneration payable to M/s. Kiran J. Mehta & Co., Cost Accountants, Ahmedabad, is included in the Notice convening the 45th Annual General Meeting.

The Company has not accepted any deposit from the public during the year under review within the meaning of Section 73(a) of the Companies Act, 2013.





(B) INDEPENDENT DIRECTORS' COMPENSATION AND DISCLOSURES:

These Financial Statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) as per the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) (Amendment) Rules, 2016 notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the 'Act') and other relevant provisions of the Act.

The Financial statements up to and for the year ended 31st March 2016 were prepared to comply in the material aspects with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Act.

The previous year figures have been regrouped/reclassified or restated as per Ind AS, so as to make the figures comparable with the figures of current year.

As these are the first Financial Statements prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS), Ind AS 101' First Time Adoption of Indian Accounting Standards' has been applied. An explanation of how the transition to Ind As has affected previously reported financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company is provided in note 6.

- iii. Diversity of the Board.
- e. Board of Directors takes into consideration the performance evaluation of the Directors and his engagement level.

(2) Remuneration:

- ii. The Directors shall be entitled to receive remuneration by way of sitting fees, for each of the meeting of Board or Committee of the Board attended by them as approved by the Board of Directors within the overall limits prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014, in addition to reimbursement of expenses, if any, for participation in the Board / Committee Meetings
- iii. The Company does not have any Stock option plan, performance linked incentive scheme or commission scheme.
- iv. The details of sitting fees paid to the Directors for attending Board and Committee Meetings during the Financial Year 2016-17 are given under the heading Details of Board Meeting in this report.

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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

A. INDUSTRY OVERVIEW:

The Company manufactures High Chromium Grinding Media Balls which are used in the process of Crushing/Grinding in the Cement and Mining industries as well as in Thermal Power Plants. These industries are the basic drivers for any infrastructure development, which is necessary for the economy to grow. In this respect, the demand for Company's products can be expected to be fairly good. However, the Company has to meet the challenge of competition and has to keep the costs under control by constant vigilance and develop better quality products to remain ahead in the business.

B. SEGMENTWISE PERFORMANCE:

The Company primarily operates in only one segment i.e. manufacturing of High Chrome Grinding Media Balls.

OUT LOOK AND PROSPECTS

Since Grinding Media is a consumable item in the manufacture of Cement, Ore/Coal crushing, there is always a requirement of this item for replenishment / replacement. To that extent, the prospects remain good. However for further growth, the new industries have to come up but at present there are not enough forecasts for major additions in these sectors.

CAPEX PLAN:

At present the Company's manufacturing capacity is 42,000 / Annum of High Chrome Grinding Media Balls. There are no immediate plans to enhance the capacity further.

RISKS AND CONCERNS:

The Company is exposed to normal operating business risks, similar to most manufacturing, companies like fluctuations in raw material prices, labour unrest, reduced demand etc. which are mitigated by regular monitoring and corrective actions.

INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS AND ADEQUACY:

The Company has proper and adequate system of internal controls commensurate to its size and nature of operations to provide reasonable assurance that all assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorized, recorded & reported properly to ascertain operating business risks, which is mitigated by regular monitoring and corrective actions.

The internal control system has been designed so as to ensure that the financial and other records are reliable and reflects a true and fair view of the state of the Company's business.

A qualified and independent Audit Committee of the Board of Directors actively reviews the adequacy and effectiveness of internal control systems and suggests improvements for strengthening them. Similarly the Internal Auditors are also monitoring the Internal Control Systems.

Note 28 Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts for the year ended 31st March 2017.

A Company Overview:

Welcast Steels Limited ('Welcast') is a subsidiary company of AIA Engineering Limited. The company is a public limited company domiciled in India and is incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act applicable in India. The registered office of the company is located at 115-116, G. V. M. M Estate, Odhav Road, Odhav, Ahmedabad - 382415. The Company is engaged in the manufacture of High Chromium Grinding Media balls for the Cement and Mining Industry.

The financial statements were approved for issue by the company's Board of Directors at their meeting held on 22nd May. 2017.

B Significant Accounting Policies

BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015.

For all periods upto and including the year ended 31st March, 2016, the Company prepared its financial statements in accordance with Accounting Standards notified under the Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read together with paragraph 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (Indian GAAP). These financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 are the first financial statements the company has prepared in accordance with Ind AS. Also refer to Note C(12).

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting except for the following material items that have been measured at fair value as required by the relevant Ind AS:

- a) Financial assets and liabilities are measured at Fair value/amortised costs
- b) Defined employee post retirements Benefit and other Long term Employee Benefits.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires management to make estimates, judgements and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the current and future periods.

II. PROPERTY, PLANT & EQUIPMENT (PPE)

- a) Property, Plant & Equipment are stated at the cost of acquisition or construction less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment loss, if any. All direct costs and cost of financing relating to the specific borrowing attributable to the eligible PPE till they are commissioned are capitalized and CENVAT credit / VAT credit availed/ available on the capital goods are deducted from the cost of the corresponding assets. Capital work-in-progress includes cost of assets at sites and construction expenditure.
- b) Depreciation on fixed assets is charged on written down value method over the useful life of assets as prescribed by Schedule II (except for Plant & Machinery for which useful life determined as per technical estimate) of Companies Act, 2013 as follows:

- c) Profit / Loss on disposal of fixed assets are credited / charged, as the case may be, to Statement Profit and Loss.
- d) Intangible Assets are recognized at cost less any accumulated amortization and impairment losses if any. Acquired intangible assets are capitalised at acquisition price.
- e) Computer Software being Intangible asset amortised over a period of 3 years on WDV basis.

III. INVENTORIES

- a) Finished Goods and Work in process are valued at cost or net realizable value whichever is lower. Cost represents material cost, labour cost, and other appropriate overheads. Finished Goods are valued inclusive of excise duty.
- b) Raw Materials, Stores & Spares and other inputs are valued at cost after considering credit of refundable taxes or net realizable value whichever is lower, cost being determined on moving weighted average method. However raw



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materials and other inputs held for use in or in relation to production are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be used are expected to be sold at or above cost.

c) Excess / shortage, if any, with in acceptable norms arising on physical verification are absorbed in the respective consumption accounts.

IV. REVENUE RECOGNITION

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership are transferred to the buyer which generally coincide when the goods are dispatched from the factory as per the terms of contract of sale. Sales value are inclusive of Excise Duty and exclusive of Value Added Tax and Central Sales Tax.

V. EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

a) **Defined Contribution plans:**

These are plans in which the Company pays pre defined amounts to separate funds, and does not have any legal or informal obligation to pay any additional sums. These comprise of defined contribution plans for employees comprising of government administered employees provident fund and pension plans. The contribution paid / payable to these plans during the year is charged to statement of profit and loss for the year on accrual basis.

b) Defined benefit plans:

- i. Gratuity: The Company makes contributions to the employees' group gratuity-cum-life assurance scheme of the Life Insurance Corporation of India. The net present value of the obligation for gratuity benefits is determined on actuarial valuation conducted annually by an independent Actuary using the projected unit credit method, as adjusted for un recognized past service cost, if any, and as reduced by the fair value of the plan assets, is recognized in the accounts. Remeasurements, comprising of actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the balance sheet with a corresponding debit or credit to retained earnings through OCI in the period in which they occur. Remeasurements are not reclassified to profit or loss in subsequent periods.
- ii. Compensated absence: The Company has a scheme to compensate absence for employees. The liability of which is determined on the basis of an actuarial valuation carried out by an independent actuary at the end of the year. The actuarial gains or losses are recognized in full in the statement of profit and loss for the period in which they occur.
- iii. Short term employee benefit: All employee benefits which are wholly due within twelve months of rendering the services are recognized in the period in which the employee renders the related services.

VI. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Foreign currency transactions are accounted for at the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Gains / losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translations of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currency as at the year end are recognized in the statement of profit and loss.

VII. TAXATION

Tax on income for the current period is determined on the basis of taxable income estimated in accordance with provisions of Income tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax asset is recognized for the future tax consequences of the temporary difference between the tax base and the carrying values of assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is reasonable certainty that they will be realized in future and are reviewed every year . The tax effect is calculated on the accumulated timing differences at the end of the year based on enacted or substantively enacted tax rates.

VIII. IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS

At each Balance Sheet date, the management reviews the carrying amounts of its assets included in each cash generating unit to determine whether there is any indication that those assets were impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of impairment loss. Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows expected from the continuing use of the asset and from its disposal are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects the current market assessments of time value of money and risks specific to the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belongs is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognized in the statement of profit and loss.

Impairment losses recognized in prior years, if any, are reversed when there is an indication that recognized impairment losses for the asset, no longer exist or have decreased. However, the increase in carrying amount of an asset due to reversal of an impairment loss is recognized to the extent it does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognized for the asset in prior years.

IX. PROVISIONS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

Provisions in respect of present obligations arising out of past events are made in the accounts when reliable estimates can be made of the amount of the obligations. Contingent liabilities, if material, are disclosed by way of Notes to Accounts. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

X CASHFLOW STATEMENT

The Cash Flow Statement is prepared in accordance with Ind AS 7 "Statement of Cash Flows" and presents the cash flows by operating, investing and financing activities of the Company. Cash and Cash equivalents presented in the



(Contd..)

Cash Flow Statement consist of cash on hand, Balances with Schedule Bank and fixed deposits which are readily convertible into cash.

XI. EARNINGS PER SHARE

Basic earnings per share is arrived at based on net profit after taxation available to the equity shareholders to the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earnings per share is calculated on the same basis as basic earnings per share after adjusting for the effects of potential dilutive equity shares.

1) Proposed Dividend

As per Indian GAAP, Proposed dividends shall be recognised as a liability in the books of accounts based in the period to which such dividends are related. However as per Ind AS, Dividend provision/recognition shall be made the period in which it is declared. Proposed Dividend Rs 12.76 Lacs and Dividend Distribution Tax Rs 2.59 Lacs as on 01.04.2015 is derecognised.

2) De-recognition of Prior Period Expense:

As per Ind AS prior period expenses are to be accounted in the financial year to which the relate to. Accordingly the prior period expenses Rs 2.44 Lacs during the year 2015-16 are de-recognised and adjusted in Retained Earnings.

3) Capitalisation of Stores as per Ind AS 16.

As per Ind AS, stores which meet the definition of Property, Plant and Equipment are to be capitalised. Accordingly Stores amounting to Rs 17.29 Lacs. Correspondingly depreciation charge for the FY 2015-16 is increased by Rs 7.79 Lacs.

4) Withdrawl of Revaluation Reserve:

As per Ind AS the company has to chose to adopt either the cost model or revlaution model for Property, Plant & Equipment. The company has adopted the cost model and accordingly Revlaution reserve as on 01.04.2015 Rs 9.11 Lacs. Depreciation charge on revalution component Rs 1.13 Lacs has been reversed during the year 2015-16.

5) Changes in Deferred Tax on Account of Change in PPE:

As change made in Property Plant & Equipment, deferred tax as on 31.03.2016 has undergone change, net impact Rs 3.02 Lacs.

6) Remeasurements of Acturial Valuation on Gratuity

In terms of Ind AS the re-measurement adjustments are to be accounted through Other Comprehensive Income, hence corresponding adjustments done in employee benefit expenses, Rs 18.65 Lacs (Deferred Tax Rs 5.76 Lacs).

7) Re-classification between Cash and Cash equivalents and Other Bank Balances, Current Assets and Non-Current

Assets In terms of Ind AS few items has been re-classified between Cash and Cash Equivalents Rs 5.04 Lacs and Current and Non-Current Assets Rs 95.24 Lacs.

8) Excise Duty Collected

In terms of excise duty collected on Sales during the FY 2015-16 Rs 1015.67 Lacs has been reduced from Total Revenue and shown seperately as expenses.
